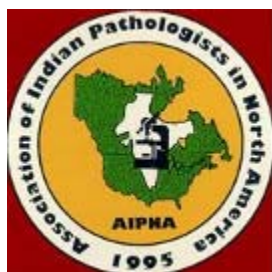

Coverage of AIPNA member activities for 2008:

1. **ASCP - AIPNA Companion Meeting** went very well. There were 3 guest speakers: **Dr Dhanpat Jain**, Yale New Haven, CT, **Dr Neil Theise**, Albert Einstein Medical Center, New York and **Dr Martha Pitman**, MGH Boston, MA. There were 30 participants and introductory remarks from some of the participants were very encouraging (Dr Nirag Jhala).
2. The **International Conference on Pathology of Chest Disorders: an integrated Approach**, which was Co sponsored by: Pulmonary Pathology Society, Division of United States and Canadian Academy of Pathology and Pulmonary Pathology Society of India was held in the **Paintal Memorial Golden Jubilee Auditorium V. P. Chest Institute, University of Delhi, on the 6th and 7th December 2008**. Eminent International faculty included **Dr. Jaishree Jagirdar**, Director of Anatomic Pathology at the University of Texas, USA. **Dr Abida Haque**, Houston, Texas, **Dr F Armando** Boston, Massachusetts. **Dr Alberto Marchevsky**, Professor of Pathology at UCLA. **Dr Allen Gibbs**, England, **Dr Helmut Popper**, Austria, **Dr. Dina Mody**, Director and Head of Cytopathology, Texas. **Dr Henry Tazelaar**, Mayo Clinic, Scottsdale Arizona, **Dr Peter Julien**, Cedar Sinai Hospital, LA, **Dr Kusum Kapila**, Kuwait. Eminent National faculty included **Dr V. K. Vijayan**, Director and Head of Pulmonary Medicine at Vallabhbhai Patel Chest Institute, **Dr Jaya Deshpande**, Mumbai, **Dr Kusum Joshi**, PGI, Chandigarh, **Dr Manoj Singh**, AIIMS, Delhi, **Dr S. K. Jindal**, PGI Chandigarh, **Dr N Jambhekar**, TMH, Mumbai, **Dr Usha Kini**, St Johns, Bangalore, **Dr Pradeep Vaideshwar** KEM hospital Mumbai, **Dr Rajkumar**, VP Chest Institute, Delhi and **Dr Ravi Mehrotra**, MLN Medical college, Allahabad.
3. **Dr. Rajan Dewar**, Staff Hematopathologist and Molecular pathologist from Harvard Medical School and Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center visited Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences University, Karad on Oct 13th, 2008. He presented a glass slide seminar for post graduates in pathology and pathologists and discussed the differential diagnosis of morphologically similar lymphomas and role and importance of immunophenotyping in differentiating them. He also introduced some new/ evolving entities such as 'senile EBV positive polymorphic B cell lymphoma' and 'Grey zone lymphoma' to the participants. He conducted Power point presentation on unknown cases which he had forwarded to the post graduates. He discussed basic aspects of myeloid neoplasm: Myeloid leukemias, MPDs and MDS, changes in the new WHO classifications, JAK2 mutation, importance of diagnosing the conditions at molecular and cytogenetic level and role of them in targeted

therapy and prognosis. He made all the PGs understand the morphologic features of ATLL-HTLV-I, Primary effusion lymphoma, Mantle cell lymphoma and basics of flow cytometry immunophenotyping. In the afternoon there was a power point presentation on his current and past research on 'Stem cells and myeloproliferative disorders' for residents and staff members of Pathology, Medicine and Pediatrics. There was a question-answer session and active discussion around this.

4. **Dr Bakul Dalal** visited Ahmedabad for a two-day Hematology CME for internal medicine physicians (200 registrants), pediatricians (50), pathologists (100) and post graduate students. Along with august faculty like Drs. **Mammen Chandy** and **M.B. Agrawal** of India, he gave an evening seminar for Oncologists and PG students.
