Dr. Rajal Shah and his team were awarded the Team Award by the AACR (first such award) in front of a huge audience of 17000 attendees. Select team members from the University of Michigan including Dr. Rajal B. Shah, Associate Professor of Pathology and Urology, and select team members from Harvard Medical center received "First inaugural research team science award for their work on Prostate cancer recurrent gene fusions by the American Association of Cancer Research (AACR) at centennial celebration meeting in Los Angeles". The purpose of this research award was to foster and recognize multidisciplinary team science. From over 30 applications this team was selected and collectively awarded \$50000 prize money and plaque.

Dr. Meenakshi Singh gave a ASCP teleconference on Atypical ductal hyperplasia in June.
